Initiative and Innovation Review Process Vocabulary and Reflection Questions

The document provides key vocabulary and questions to support District Implementation Teams when viewing the recorded module prior to the Initiative and Innovation Review module.

Key Vocabulary

Initiative and Innovation Review Process-process that leads to careful analysis of a proposed initiative or innovation (e.g., evidence-based programs, practices, assessments) to inform a selection or de-selection decision.

Hexagon Tool-a tool developed by the National Implementation Research Network to support selection and de-selection of programs and practices. The initiative and innovation review process is framed around the six indicators within the hexagon tool (e.g., need, evidence, fit, usability, capacity, supports).
