Data Coordination and Assessment System Vocabulary and Reflection Questions

The document provides key vocabulary and questions to support District Implementation Teams when viewing the recorded module prior to the Data Coordination and Assessment System module.

Key Vocabulary

Assessment System-a coordinated system used to organize assessment information to ensure accurate and timely data are provided and effectively used for decision-making. Includes student assessments (e.g., universal screeners, progress monitoring, diagnostic, summative) and system assessments (e.g., capacity, fidelity).

Assessment Schedule-outlines the timelines and windows for data collection for each assessment the district supports.

Data Coordinators-individuals who oversee and support the collection and use of assessment data (e.g., SWIS facilitators, Acadience Mentors, TFI Facilitators).
