# **Getting Ready for Early Childhood PBIS**

This document provides possible readiness activities and a recommended training sequence for Early Childhood Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (EC PBIS), a multi-tiered system of supports (MTSS) for social-emotional-behavioral health for preschool children.

## Readiness Activities

The following are possible activities to build readiness within your program, district, or ISD.

## **Systems**

- Review the <u>Program-Wide Implementation</u> document from the National Center for Pyramid Model Innovations; share it with leadership at your program.
- Consider what schools or centers in your district or region would be good candidates for EC PBIS and start having conversations with site administrators and staff.
- Review the Key Roles for Implementing EC PBIS on the EC PBIS page of the MiMTSS
   <u>MiMTSS TA Center website</u>. Begin identifying individuals who could sit on a Leadership Team,
   someone to serve as a Leadership Team Coach, and individuals with the time and
   expertise to provide classroom coaching to teaching teams.
- Begin developing staff buy-in through a staff buy-in presentation.
- Review the similarities and differences provided in the <u>PBS in Early Childhood document</u> if your school or district is implementing school-wide PBIS.
- Begin thinking about how to develop family partnerships (e.g., identify family organizations that could provide input and support the work).
- Review the research! Read <u>Bringing Social</u>, <u>Emotional</u>, <u>and Behavioral Teaching</u>
  Practices to Pre-K and Kindergarten Classrooms: <u>Implementing</u> the Pyramid Model.

#### **Practices**

- Provide an overview of Pyramid Model Practices to staff; consider the <u>Pyramid Model</u> <u>Overview</u>.
- Identify one teaching team and one Classroom Coach to attend <u>Preschool Pyramid</u> <u>Model Practices</u> and <u>Practice-Based Coaching</u> and encourage them to share their experience with others at the site.
- Take stock of current curriculum materials, programs, or strategies used in your classrooms that address behavior and social-emotional competencies.
- Explore some <u>practical strategies and classroom resources</u> from the National Center for Pyramid Model Innovations (NCPMI).



#### Data

- Determine what implementation (fidelity) and impact (outcome) data is already being collected within your program and where gaps might exist. Review the questions and tools provided in the <a href="Data-Informed Decision-Making for School Teams">Data-Informed Decision-Making for School Teams</a> as a reference.
- Review the items on the Benchmarks of Quality (Leadership Team self-assessment).
- If you have access to a SWIS Facilitator, ask them to look into completing the EC-SWIS Facilitator course through PBISApps.
- Begin learning about the collection and use of Behavior Incident Report data by accessing the BIR Overview.
- Get started using data right away; attend the <u>Early Childhood Behavior Incident Reports</u> (BIR) training to begin collecting and analyzing behavior data from classrooms.

## Recommended Training Sequence

Although there are a number of paths, the following is the recommended training sequence for schools or centers interested in implementing EC PBIS with fidelity.

## 1. EC PBIS Leadership Team Training

- Audience: Leadership Team members and EC PBIS Leadership Team Coach
- Includes a separate Coaching Support Session for EC PBIS Leadership Team Coaches

## 2. Preschool Pyramid Model Practices

- Audience: All Leadership Team members, teaching staff, and any staff assigned to preschool classrooms (e.g., coaches, behavior support staff, teacher consultants, etc.)
- Teaching staff should only attend if they have an assigned Classroom Coach who is also attending or has been previously trained

## 3. Practice-Based Coaching and Teaching Pyramid Observation Tool (TPOT)

- Audience: Classroom Coaches who have completed the Pyramid Model Practices
- Completion of requirements will lead to observers becoming "Reliable TPOT Observers"

## 4. Early Childhood Behavior Incident Reports (BIR)

- Audience: Leadership Teams, Data Coordinators, and Leadership Team Coaches
- Training content is compatible with BIR collection using EC-SWIS or the Behavior Incident Report System (BIRS)

## 5. Prevent, Teach, Reinforce for Young Children (PTR-YC)

- Audience: Classroom Coaches, Leadership Team Coaches, and Behavior Support Staff
- Must have completed Preschool Pyramid Practices

## **Ongoing Support for Coaches**

- Pyramid Model Preschool Classroom Coach Community of Practice
- EC PBIS Leadership Team Coach Community of Practice
