Reading Assessments to Inform Children's Assets and Needs

The intention of this resource is to provide definitions and acronyms used to help build and affirm our background knowledge.

Definitions

Evidence-Based: Empirically proven practices (rigorous field testing, use experimental design, peer reviewed)

Family: All parents, guardians, and/or caregivers and the student.

Multi-Tiered System of Support (MTSS): MTSS is a comprehensive framework that includes three distinct tiers of instructional support and is composed of a collection of evidence-based strategies designed to meet the individual needs and assets of the whole child.

Program Mastery: Assessments designed to measure the mastery of specific content that are sensitive to change, easy to administer, and delivered at regular intervals, with a scale that changes across the different assessments.

Progress Monitoring: An assessment that is used after a child has been matched with intervention support to determine if intervention is needed and/or if supports need to be modified, changed, or faded.

Reliability: Based on the consistency of a set of scores that are designed to measure the same thing.

Universal Screening is a brief assessment used three times a year to help determine if a learner needs additional supports and provide data to inform decisions.

Validity: The extent to which an assessment measures what it claims to measure.

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
